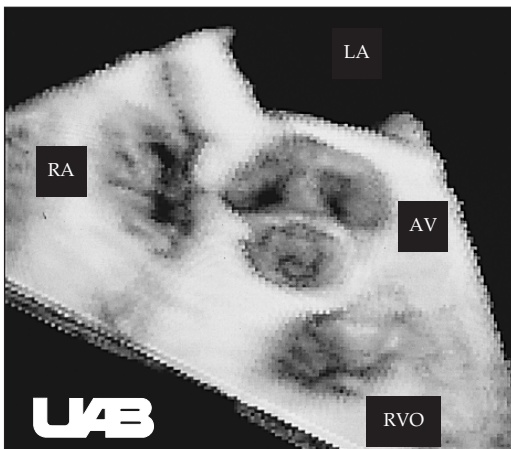

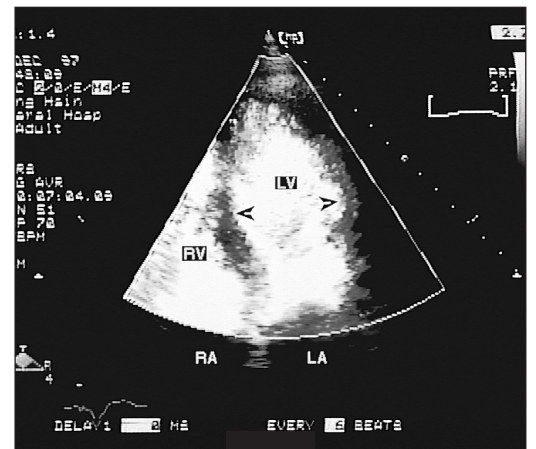

Purpose: This conference is designed to provide a review of echocardiography and allied techniques (MRI, CT Scan, Nuclear) with emphasis on case studies dealing with valvular heart disease, endocarditis, valve repair, peripheral arterial diseases, prosthetic valves, heart failure, tumors, embolism, trauma, dissection, adult congenital heart disease, coronary artery disease, stress, intraoperative, 3-dimensional, LV strain/strain rate, Doppler tissue imaging, velocity vector imaging and contrast echocardiography. Although the symposium is designed mainly for physicians and technologists, we invite nurses, and other health and industry professionals to attend. The Conference registration fee is \$65.00 for anyone needing CME certification and no cost if CME certification is not needed. Onsite registration will be taken until 10:00 am. There are no special prerequisites.

Objectives: We expect the attendees to acquire and enhance their knowledge of various aspects of echocardiography; to be able to describe uses of basic modes of display for cardiac assessment; recognize normal anatomy and pathology of the heart from ultrasound images and to describe the use of Doppler ultrasound in the assessment of blood flow within the heart.
