COURSE DESCRIPTION Cardiovascular disease (CVD) remains the number one killer worldwide in both men and women. An estimated 17.3 million people died from CVD in 2008, representing 30% of all global deaths. A cardiovascular disease-related event causes a death every minute in the United States. It is projected that the number of people who will die from cardiovascular disease will increase to 23.3 million by 2030. The "Invasive Cardiology Update for Practicing Physicians" symposium aims to offer the latest updates on diagnostic and treatment strategies that assess the risk of coronary artery disease, peripheral artery disease, congestive heart failure, valvular heart disease, arrhythmias, and preventive cardiology. The didactic learning method is poised to support practitioners' efforts to remain abreast of new and emerging approaches in the field of interventional cardiology. The goal of this course is to provide practicing physicians with education on best practices needed to improve patient outcomes and reduce morbidity and mortality related to cardiovascular disease.
